From the Director

Dear Friends,

Thank you so much for visiting my website. This project is endorsed by Victory Missionary Baptist Church of Russellville, Arkansas. My goal is to encourage more churches to pass out gospel tracts. In Isaiah 55:11, God's Word tells us three things: (1) His Word will not return unto Him void or empty, (2) it will accomplish what He wants, and (3) it will prosper. Do you believe that verse? If so, what are you doing to get the Word of God into the hands of the people? One of the easiest ways to do evangelism is to pass out gospel tracts. Many people have been convicted of their sins by reading a gospel tract and then trusted Jesus as their Savior. Please take a few minutes and check out the rest of my website. I want to encourage your church to sign up for the Isaiah 55:11 Project. There are six areas in which your church can sign up:

(1) Isaiah 55:11 Project - This program encourages church members to pass out one gospel tract a day for 30 days.

- (2) Blitzing neighborhoods We ordered door hangers and put a nice brochure of our church, a business card and two gospel tracts in each bag. Then, I went to our Chamber of Commerce and got a map of our city. Our goal is to put a door hanger on every home in the city of Russellville. When we cover a street, I color it on the map. If we go, God will bless. Six weeks after we started this project we broke our three-year Sunday School record. We are blitzing neighborhoods once and sometimes twice a week. I am writing this the first week in February 2014. Since September 2013, we have broken our Sunday School record five times.
- (3) 'Go into All the World' Summer Campaign Ask the families in your church to pick up one or more packs of gospel tracts and pass them out on their family vacation. (Browse the website to find out different ways to pass out tracts). Have them write down the city and state, and where they distribute the tracts. When they return home, have them give their distribution information to a coordinator who can compile all the results. At the end of the summer, share with your church all the places in which the gospel has been shared.

- (4) Special events Many communities have special events throughout the year. A great way to pass out gospel tracts is to rent a booth and give out free gospel tracts. Each year, in our town, we have a Business Expo in August, rodeo and carnival at the fairgrounds in September, and Octoberfest in the fall. For us, this is an ideal way to pass out tracts.
- (5) Halloween/Trunk or Treat When trick or treaters come to your door give them a gospel tract along with candy. If you have kids who go trick or treating, encourage the children to give a gospel tract to the ones who gives them candy. If your church has trunk or treat, be sure to give out gospel tracts when you pass out candy.
- (6) Christmas parades The BEST way to pass out Christmas tracts is to get sandwich bags, put two or three pieces of candy in each bag along with a gospel tract. When you pass these out at parades, not only will the kids be glad to receive them, but it will put a smile on the adult's faces as well.

These are just a few ways to get a gospel tract ministry started in your church. Again, I want to encourage your church to get

involved in this ministry. Please sign up and tell us how many

tracts you are passing out each month, so we can add it to our

total. Our first goal is to pass out 1,000,000 tracts. If I can help

KOINE Collation

The Collation Process of KOINE Packets occurs during a designated time by designated KOINE Campaigners in a designated place:

KLASS Director oversees and assures,

Time: KLASS time on Sunday Morning

Materials: Tracts, Brochures and Business Cards

Collation: Assembly and Filling Koine Packets

Minimum and Maximum inventories: 100 packets on-hand is the minimal amount; 500 Packets on-hand is the maximum amount.

Note: The KOINE Project Principle then, holds that if an outcome is to be duplicated, so too must the process which originally created it, and that there are certain constant necessary conditions for that outcome to be reached.



The KOINE Project Cycle




Deliberate Practice

"The core assumption of deliberate practice is that expert performance is acquired gradually, and that effective improvement of performance requires the opportunity to find suitable training tasks that the performer can master sequentially. . . typically monitored by a teacher or coach" (Ericsson, 2006, p. 692). Deliberate practice requires good performers to concentrate on specific skills that are just beyond their current proficiency levels (Kindle Locations 351-354). Consequently, then "KOINE Project Functions" encourage the development of disciple-making expertise through Deliberate Practice. Deliberately Practicing the sustainment of Core KOINE **Project Elements** leads to the achievement of catalyzing the disciple-making process by "Plugging-in" new disciples into the KOINE Project Cycle according to the KOINE Project Element or Function to which new disciples are best suited.

The KOINE Project: Continuous Action

An Observation: While the KOINE Packets are

in a continuous process of entering each community's neighborhoods, Packet Collation, along with KLASS Training will simultaneously operate in a continuous, perpetual manner.
